# The Study:

As a new year draws closer, and a season of rest and renewal beckons with Advent and Christmas, it's important to *"find the wonder"*, and remind ourselves why following and knowing Jesus Christ isn't just good news, but the best news possible. The "Great Commission" in Matthew 28:16-20 answers two important questions: *How do I prepare my heart so that the Lord can use me*? And: *How does the Lord want to use me*?



### How Do I Prepare My Heart So That The Lord Can Use Me?

"Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me." – vss. 16-18

1. Here the disciples are with Jesus after the resurrection. Why in the world were some of them still having doubts?

2. What are some areas of the Christian life where you have struggled with doubts, or where you have questioned God?

4. Discuss the following quote by Christian apologist Paul Gould in his book, "Cultural Apologetics". What is Gould saying?

"Given God's desire for humans to flourish in a loving relationship with him, we would expect the evidence for God to be widely available. At the same time, since God wants the relationship that humans enjoy with him to be freely accepted, evidence for his existence would also be easily resistible."
