In this series on Fruitfulness, we're learning that each one of us has a work to do, a race to run, a calling to pursue.

To serve God with our *experiences* means that the Lord can take any experience we've gone through – good or bad – and use it for his purposes. There are at least 5 areas of experience we should explore:

Ministry Experiences

Painful Experiences

1. What does the Bible teach us about the way God can work through our trials, troubles, and failures?

Educational Experiences

1. On the one hand, education is not a prerequisite for serving God. In fact, sometimes it can be a hindrance. How so?

2. On the other hand, our pursuit and love of knowledge can be of great usefulness to God. How do we know this?

With this in mind, summarize your educational journey. What schools did you attend? What were some of your favorite subjects? What degrees do you have? What ongoing training and learning do you enjoy receiving?

Though it may hurt to do so, take some time to think through some of the significant times of trial, testing, and suffering that you have gone through. Reflect on how you think the Lord might use these painful experiences to help others.

An Exercise After This Teaching:

God wants us to use our experiences as a way to serve others, and share our hope in Jesus with them. We invite you to take just one of these experiences you've thought of today, and write out a 60-Second Story that describes 1) what you experienced, and 2) what the Lord taught you through the experience. (Your "Spiritual" and "Painful" experiences can be especially powerful if shared in this way.)
