This is how Jesus served and suffered for us. (vss.5-11)

- 1. How do these verses teach that Jesus is God?
 - > Jesus was in the "form" of God. What does "form" mean?

"...he did not count equality with God..." (cf. Hebrews 1:3)

Objection: If Jesus is God, then why does Paul say in verse 9, *"Therefore God has highly exalted [Jesus]..."*? Answer:

- > Paul takes Isaiah 45:22-23 and applies it to Christ.
- > Paul takes Isaiah 45:18 and applies it to Christ.
- 2. But that Jesus is God is just part of what Paul wants to share with us here. What's the real mind-blowing truth?
